Reading

At Ivington reading is regarded as a high priority. Children are given the opportunity to change their reading books every other day. We recommend that every child should read to an adult at home at least five times a week and ask that an adult signs the book each time. This will be rewarded with a step up on our reading tree. Once your child has completed the reading tree, he/she will be congratulated in class with a prize reading book and on the Tuesday newsletter.

We also have 'Book Club' each Friday where each week we discover a new book and share our love of reading with each other.



You may have heard about **BIG MATHS** already. It is fun, engaging and a great way of increasing confidence in number. Children are expected to get ten out of ten 3 weeks consecutively before moving to the next level. This enables the children to become confident and secure in all concepts of number before moving on. Any misconceptions or concepts the children are finding tricky are addressed during one-to-one interventions.

We celebrate their success with a certificate on completion of a CLIC. The children measure their own progress on a line graph in the front of their folders. This will continue once a week alongside mathematics lessons.

Pie Corbett Story telling

Your child will take part in storytelling. We will learn a new story by heart every three weeks. This is fundamental for the development of language and new vocabulary to use in writing but to also develop expression within reading. The children love to perform their stories once they have learnt them, so please try and encourage your child to perform them at home. You will thoroughly enjoy them!







This should be water. If your child would like squash, please put this in a separate bottle which they can have at lunch.











We very much look forward to welcoming the children back into school after the Easter break.
