KEY FACTS AND EVENTS				
What is a monarch?	A Monarch is someone who is a head of stat. This can be a king, queen or emperor.			
Who was Queen Elizabeth I	Elizabeth I was queen from 1558-1603. Her reign was known as the Elizabethan Era. She was queen for 44 years and had no children. She loved the arts and watching many of William Shakespeare's plays. She wore puffy dresses and high heels. She had many exotic pets including a bear, monkey and lynx.			
Who was Queen Elizabeth II	Elizabeth II was queen from 1952-2022. She had 4 children and enjoyed time with them at Buckingham Palace, Windsor Castle and Balmoral. She always wore brightly coloured dresses to ensure she could be seen in large crowds as well as low heeled shoes. She loved animals and kept many horses and dogs.			
Where do monarchs live?	Throughout history monarchs have lived in grand places and castles. These have changed through time and each monarch has added their own style to their own palace.			
What would it be like to be a monarch?	You can only become a monarch if you are the child of a king or a close blood relative. Being a monarch can be very busy and involves a lot of travel around the world.

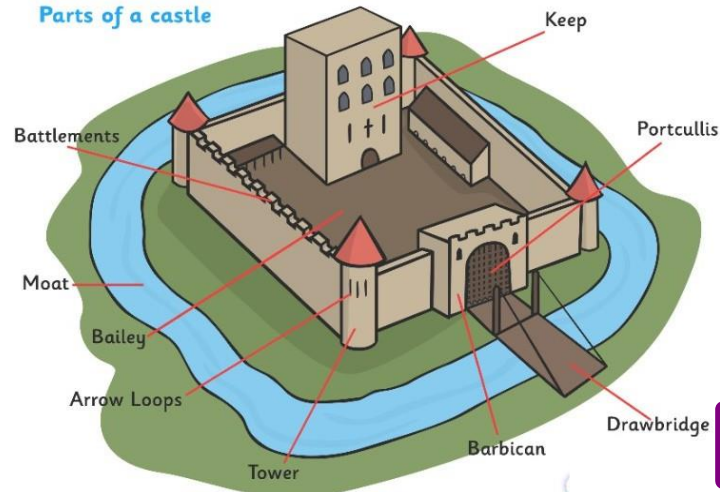
