



How do living things survive in the world around us?

Key Vocabulary	
Living	Animals and plants are living things. Living things need to have their basic needs met to survive.
Dead	If something used to be alive (or was once alive), it means it used to be living but isn't anymore. Now, it is dead.
Never been alive	Things made out of metal, glass, plastic or rock were never living because they did not move by themselves, grow or need food.
Food chain	A food chain shows how each animal gets its food. Food chains are one of the ways that living things depend on each other to stay alive



In a food chain, each arrow means 'is eaten by'.

Key Vocabulary	
Living things	Something that is living is alive. It can grow, reproduce, move, feed and get rid of waste material.
Habitat	A habitat is the natural place in which something lives. A habitat provides living things with everything they need to survive.
Environment	The surroundings or conditions in which a person, animal, or plant lives or operates.
Adaptation	Changes that living things develop to survive in their habitats.
investigation	Process of studying or examining in detail.
observation	Act of carefully watching or examining something.
