Key Facts

- France is a country in Europe and its capital city is Paris. The river Seine flows through Paris which has many famous landmarks including the Eiffel Tower, Arc de Triumphe and Notre Dame Cathedral.
- The French flag is called the Tricolour. The blue in the flag represents freedom, the white represents equality and the red represents brotherhood.
- The French Alps is a popular tourist destination for skiing. Its highest peak is Mont Blanc (4810 m. high).
- The bodies of water around France include the Mediterranean Sea, the North Sea, the Atlantic Ocean, the Rhine River and the English Channel.
- France is famous for fashion and perfume. French fashion brands include Chanel, Givenchy and Dior.
- The French Impressionists and many famous artists were born in France, including Monet, Renoir and Matisse. The Louvre Art Gallery is in Paris.
- The 'Tour de France' cycle race takes place every July. The cyclist's cycle 3,479.3 kilometres in 23 days and the winner gets to wear a yellow jersey.
